DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Elizabethtown College's Center for Continuing Education and Distance Learning seeks to extend the boundaries of the College's learning community to include a wider and more diverse population. The Center expresses the values of the College's mission through a commitment to and advocacy of degree and non-degree academic programs for adult learners. In particular, the Center embraces the values of human dignity and social justice by widening access to quality higher education for adults. In support of this mission, the Center awards scholarships to those individuals who have demonstrated professional and/or academic achievement and financial need.

Applications for scholarships are accepted on an ongoing basis. Five \$1,000 scholarships are available each academic year; three awarded in fall and two in spring. Unused scholarships carry over to the following semester within the academic year.

Applicants must adhere to the following requirements for scholarship consideration:

Submission of a brief statement demonstrating financial need and academic and professional goals;

Submission of a resume outlining work experience;

Applicants must be enrolled at or accepted to Elizabethtown College's Adult Degree Program;

Applicants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (www.fafsa.ed.gov); Note for students applying for federal financial aid consideration: Federal regulations prohibit a student from receiving scholarship, grant and loan resources in excess of demonstrated need. Financial aid awards will be adjusted, if necessary, to remain within allowable limits.

Applicants must be US residents;

Applicants must be degree seeking.

To apply, complete the application form (located on the back of this flyer) and give it to your admissions counselor or mail it to the Center. Applications will be reviewed by the Dean of the Center and a revolving panel of two members of either the CCEDL Management team or the Center's Council for Academic Management, and the College's Financial Aid Director. These scholarship funds have no monetary value other than as a credit toward tuition in an Elizabethtown College accelerated credit course.
